SUMMER SCHOOL ON GLOBAL MANAGEMENT IN THE EUROPEAN CULTURAL CONTEXT

The global business environment is constantly becoming more international and culturally diverse requiring leaders to face new challenges related to leadership, international trade, cross-cultural communication and effective human resources management. The Summer Program on Global and European Business Management aims at responding to the needs of future managers working for international organizations and across national borders.

The two-week program will address issues related to the European business environment, cross-cultural communication, personnel management, diversity in organizations etc. Participants will take part in seminars and workshops as well as study visits in order to better understand the issues related to international business-making and management issues in global organizations.

SUMMER SCHOOL ON THE EUROPEAN NEIGHBOURHOOD POLICY: THE EASTERN AND SOUTHERN PERSPECTIVES

The European Neighbourhood Policy (ENP) is a European Union's instrument serving to reinforce relations with neighbouring countries to the East and South in order to promote prosperity, stability and security that are in the mutual interest of the EU and its neighbours. The increasing challenges on the Eastern and Southern borders of the EU call for tighter cooperation between the Member States and between the EU and its neighbours as well as international partners. The ENP takes relations beyond standard cooperation or trade agreements to offer political association and deeper economic integration, as well as development and humanitarian assistance in regions that require Building on common interests and values — democracy, the rule of law, respect for human rights, and social cohesion the ENP is a key part of the European Union's foreign policy. How is it operated? How are policies developed and introduced? What are its effects? And finally, what are the prospects for the future? – These are the questions that Participants of the Summer School will be able to answer once they complete their training. The International Summer School will consist of 12 days of lectures, seminars, workshops and study visits.

SUMMER SCHOOL ON HUMAN SEXUALITY AND SEXUAL HEALTH

Human sexuality is a topic related to a number of areas of life, from popular culture to the master bedroom. Understanding the complex dimensions of sexuality requires a multidisciplinary approach and taking into consideration the study of culture, relationships, biology, medicine, behaviours, and emotions. The Summer School on human sexuality and sexual health explores all of those fields in order to give participants insight into the various cultural and psychological approaches to sexuality.

The two-week course will explore topics related to the individual understanding of own sexuality; intimacy; sexual orientation; medical issues in sexology; the relationship between sexuality and religion, race and ethnicity; new directions in sexuality scholarship as well applications of sex-related research to social and clinical issues.

THE SUMMER SCHOOL ON POLISH LANGUAGE AND CULTURE

The courses of Polish are taught at levels of proficiency (B2 and C1) according to the Common European Framework of Reference). Each course offers 75 h. The courses of Polish have been designed for those interested in general language. Apart from assisting with the development of all language skills (speaking, listening, reading and writing) we will help you to learn grammar and language functions needed for your life at Polish universities and in business contacts. Groups will be formed depending on the students language level. General Polish courses will include topics on history, literature, film, theatre, art and music. We will visit places such as Zachęta – the National Gallery of Art, the National Museum, the Fryderyk Chopin Museum, the Royal Castle and the Warsaw Uprising Museum, Museum of the history of Polish Jews. Twice a week we will watch a contemporary Polish film.

Dates: 24 July to 4 August 2017

Cost: 500 euro

The participation fee includes:

- participation in all courses, workshops and seminars
- participation in the cultural programme
- certificates and academic transcripts

Accommodation:

The university will offer participants accommodation in student residences located in Warsaw. The accommodation fee is set at 175 EUR per the entire period of the summer school (based on two students sharing one room).
