Traditional and modern approaches to teaching foreign languages: their pedagogical and psychological foundations, goals, techniques, advantages and disadvantages. Integrated approaches to teaching foreign languages: CLIL and CALL. Bilingual education in kindergartens, primary schools, secondary schools and universities. Types of bilingualism and types of bilingual education (goals and forms of each of them).
