Requirements for passing the course: Active participation in classes, completion of ongoing tasks are evaluated. The subject ends with an oral exam. Verification of the degree of acquisition of relevant knowledge, skills and competences of the student is carried out on the basis of practical examinations during the semester teaching of the subject. Subject evaluation: A – 100%-93% B – 92%-85% C – 84%-77% D – 76%-69% E – 68%-60% Fx – 59%- 0%	
Learning outcomes of the course: The subject focuses on the issue of studying the sound side of the Italian language. After completing the subject, the student will acquire the following knowledge, skills and competences: Knowledge: what is phonetics, phonology, and other related subjects. He will also learn the basics the history of phonetics and phonology and the general history of didactics of the Italian language. Skills: The student learns the processes of making sounds and learns to recognize special phonemes Italian dialects. Learn to recognize and control the accents and inflections of your own mother tongue. Competences: The student is able to select an appropriate text for language didactics and improve it capacity and interest in other foreign languages. He is able to design, implement and analyze lessons with an emphasis on the sound aspects of foreign languages.	
Course contents: The subject focuses on the issue of studying the sound side of the Italian language and the relationship phoneme/grapheme. Linguistic knowledge, which is in an interdisciplinary way, dominates enriched by the results of research in several other scientific and study fields (physiology, acoustics, theory of communication, special sciences, informatics and others.	

The practical part is first dominated by listening to native speakers, also thanks to didactic aids, and then moving on to the students' own reading of suitable texts designed to distinguish the needs of different accents (interrogative, declarative, etc...) of the Italian language and their meanings .
