Learning outcomes of the course:

The aim of the course is to introduce the student to the world of Italian literary culture.

Knowledge: The student recognizes changes in culture and literature between VII. and XIII. century.

Skills: The student will learn the processes of creating Italian literature from Latin to Italian.

Competences: The student is able to choose an appropriate text for language didactics and improve capacity and interest in other foreign languages. He is able to design, implement and analyze lessons with an emphasis on the sound side of foreign languages.

Course contents:

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1. Acquaintance of students with literature in the "Volgare" language
2. The first documents written in a language other than Latin
3. Gradual transition to literature in Italian.
4. Using folk dialects for practical purposes
5. Using dialects to represent moments from the lives of saints and martyrs
6. Influence of early literary works in Occitan dialects

7. Literary works of Saint Francis of Assisi
8. Laudi, Jacopone da Todi
9. Stilnuovo
10. Dante Alighieri
