Course contents:

1. Folklore and folkloristics.
2. Historical types of folklore. "Ceremonial/non-ceremonial" folklore.
3. Calendar folklore. Family and residential folklore. "Zagovory"
4. Basic genera and genres of non-ceremonial folklore.
5. "Herbs" and "skazki" (fairy tales). Historical songs, "zagadki", proverbs and sayings.
6. Children's folklore. Folklore of the 20th century. Post-folklore
