<b>Learning outcomes of the course:</b> <b>Objective of the subject:</b> To provide students with systematic knowledge about: the development, specifics and genres of Russian poetry and dramaturgy of the second half of the 19th century, about literary directions and about the genre system, about the writers of the given period, about the specifics of the form and content of the most important literary works of the studied period. <b>Learning outcomes:</b> After completing the subject, the student will acquire the following knowledge, skills and competences: - knows the basic characteristics of Russian poetry and dramaturgy 2nd half. 19th century (development, characteristics, trends, names, literary works, etc.) - is able to: work with a literary text, master literary terms and their meaning, identify the basic characteristics of literary works of the relevant period - can analyze the texts of poetic and dramaturgical works of Russian literature 2nd half. 19th century as a whole (form and content, in sociocultural and literary context)	
<b>Course contents:</b> 1. Development of the Russian poetry in the 2d half of the 19th century. Basic directions. A.N. Nekrasov, A.A. Fet, F.I. Tyutchev 2. Development of the Russian drama in the 2d half of the 19th century. A.N. Ostrovskiy "Bespridannitsa" and other theatre plays. A.P. Chekhov's drama works "Chayka", "Uncle Vanya", "Vishnyovy sad".
