Active participation in seminars, completion of ongoing tasks, ability to interpret and analyze literary texts are evaluated. The course ends with an oral exam.

Learning outcomes of the course:

Objective of the subject:

To provide students with systematic knowledge about: the origin, development, specifics and genres of old Russian literature and Russian literature of the 18th century, about the peculiarities of the Russian Enlightenment, classicism and sentimentalism, about the writers of the given periods, about the specifics of the form and content of the most important literary works of the studied periods.

Learning outcomes:

After completing the subject, the student will acquire the following knowledge, skills and competences:

- knows the basic characteristics of old Russian literature and Russian literature of the 18th century (origin, development, peculiarities, names, literary works, etc.)
- is able to work with a literary text, master literary terms and their meaning, identify the basic characteristics of literary works of the relevant period
- can analyze the texts of poetic, prose and dramaturgical works of Russian literature of the 11th-18th centuries. century as a whole (form and content, in sociocultural and literary context).

Course contents:

1. History and development of Old Russian literature (beginning from the 11th century)
2. Old Russian Literature: chronology, specific features, genres
3. "Povest vremennych let", "Slovo o polku Igoreve" and "Khochdeniye za tri morya" - the most prominent literary works in Old Russian literature
4. Russian literature in the 17th century
5. Russian literature in the 18th century: classicism - M.V. Lomonosov, G.R. Derzhavin, sentimentalism - A.N. Radishchev, N.M. Karamzin, drama works - D.I. Fonvizin
