<b>Requirements for passing the course:</b> During the semester, there will be two written examinations at the seminars, from both can be obtained a maximum of 10 points and a seminar work, for which it is possible to obtain max. 20 points. In order to participate in the final exam, it is necessary to obtain a total of at least 10 points from the examinations and at least 10 points from the seminar work. At the final written and oral exam, the student can get max. 60 points. The final evaluation will be based on the total number of points obtained from the seminars and the final exam. Subject evaluation: A – 100%-93%, B – 92%-85%, C – 84%-77%, D – 76%-69%, E – 68%-60%, Fx – 59%-0%
