Learning outcomes of the course: The student will learn to use vocabulary and phraseology in contact with the patient from the issues of emergency and pre-hospital care. Gains the ability to communicate by solving simultaneous situations. Student will gain knowledge of individual diagnoses and their symptoms in English.	
Course contents: 1. Diagnosis and Symptoms: Sepsis (serious blood infection), Traumatic brain injury. 2. Symptoms of Cerebral vascular accident (stroke), Cervical spine stenosis (narrowing of spinal canal), Cervical spondylosis (neck arthritis). 3. Diagnosis and Symptoms: Multiple sclerosis (MS), Peripheral neuropathy (nerve damage), Peripheral vascular disease (blocked blood vessels), Basilar artery migraine (headache). 4. Brain tumor (cancer of the brain), Concussion, Ear infection, middle ear (otitis media). 5. Diagnosis and Symptoms: Bipolar disorder (manic depressive disorder), Post-traumatic stress disorder (PTSD), Depression (excessive sadness). 6. Obsessive compulsive disorder (OCD, anxiety disorder), Schizoaffective disorder (features of schizophrenia and mood disorder). 7. Diagnosis and Symptoms: Pneumonia (lung infection), Congestive heart failure (CHF), Pleural effusion (abnormal chest fluid), Pulmonary embolism (blood clot in the lungs). 8. Diagnosis and Symptoms: Cardiomyopathy (weakened heart), Myocardial infarction (heart attack). 9. Pulmonary edema (fluid build-up in the lungs), Bradycardia (slow heart rate), Arrhythmia (abnormal heart rhythm), Pneumothorax (collapse of lung), Smoke inhalation, Anaphylaxis (severe/ life threatening allergic reaction). Broken heart syndrome (Takotsubo cardiomyopathy). 10. Diagnosis and Symptoms: Chronic liver disease, Hepatitis (liver inflammation), Jaundice (yellow skin color).
