Learning outcomes of the course: The aim of the course is to provide the student with an overview of the history and culture of ancient Rome with special emphasis on the history of Christianity, ancient culture up to the fall of the Roman Empire and the establishment of the Papal State. After completing the course, the student will acquire the following knowledge, skills and competences: - be familiar with the most important cultural and social realities from the beginnings of the settlement of the Apennine Peninsula to the end of the Western Roman Empire in 495 AD, - It is a mastery of the linguistic and cultural aspects of the history of a circumscribed period of Italian history, - can critically analyse established historical aspects in written and oral form and can formulate their own opinions and positions, critically revise and constructively defend them, - is able to apply linguistic and literary knowledge of the historical context to a variety of cultural-artistic and pragmatic-communicative activities, - is able to keep in touch with current developments in Italian philology and to pursue his/her own professional development effectively, - is able to professionally present his/her own views on a historical topic, including in a foreign language - is able to develop his/her own linguistic culture in the Italian language.
